MKGA Field Trip to Shenzhen SEZ

The Association is organizing a two-day field trip to the Shenzhen Special Economic Zone in which all interested members are invited to take part. Participants will visit a number of sites in Shenzhen and the surrounding region including the site of the Daya Bay nuclear plant. Arrangements for the trip are being made in collaboration with the Geographical Research Association of Shenzhen, a group very similar to the HKGA which includes geography teachers and officials from a number of government departments in Shenzhen among its members.

Details of this trip are as follows:

DATES: August 2-3, 1986 (Saturday-Sunday)

DEPARTURE TIME: Assembly at Hung Hom Railway Station at 8:00 a.m. on August 2. This enables participants to travel on the nonstop KCR train to Lo Wu.

COST: Lodging and food costs should not exceed HK\$250 per participant; this includes air-conditioned accommodations, lunch and dinner on August 2, and breakfast and lunch on August 3. To this will be added a proportional share of transportation expenses within the SEZ (this amount has yet to be determined by the hosts in Shenzhen). Participants whose registration is accepted will be notified on or about July 20 of the final cost estimate. Non-Chinese participants are responsible for obtaining their own visas for travel to China.

ITINERARY (subject to change):

Day 1 -- Shenzhen Planning Department, Bagualing industrial area, Bao'an County seat, Shenzhen University, Shekou Industrial Zone, Chiwan industrial district. Evening in Shenzhen Old Town.

Day 2 -- Daya Bay nuclear plant site, Xiaomeisha beach resort, agricultural sites in eastern Shenzhen, Liantang industrial district, Sha Tau Kok.

NUMBER OF PARTICIPANTS: Limited to 22 persons (owing to capacity of coaches used in Shenzhen). Registration accepted on a first-come, first-served basis.
